2. Diabetes Care Recommendation

What is Diabetes?

Diabetes Australia Victoria (2009) define Diabetes Mellitus (Diabetes) as the name given to a group of conditions that occurs when the level of glucose (a type of sugar) in the blood becomes higher than normal.

Insulin is a hormone that moves glucose from your blood stream, into the cells of your body where it is used for energy. When you have diabetes, the body either can't make enough insulin or the insulin that is being made does not work properly. This causes your blood glucose level to become too high. High blood glucose levels can affect both your short and long term health. There are two main types of diabetes - type 1 and type 2. At this stage there is no known cure for either type of diabetes, although diabetes can be well managed.

In September 2008, the Australian Diabetes Educators Association launched the 'Diabetes Self Care: 7 steps to Success'. Incorporating these 7 steps into everyday practice will assist people with diabetes to live healthy, active lives into the future.

Diabetes Self Care - 7 Steps to Success

1. Healthy Eating
2. Being Active
3. Monitoring
4. Taking Medication
5. Problem Solving
6. Healthy Coping
7. Reducing Risks

It is recommended that you seek support and education on how to incorporate the "Diabetes Self Care - 7 Steps to Success" into your lifestyle from your doctor, diabetes educator, and other health professionals.

Following the guidelines listed below with the support of your health professionals will reduce the risk of both short and long term complications.

- See your doctor and diabetes educator regularly.
- Check feet daily for any changes. See a podiatrist annually for an assessment.
- Have eyes examined when first diagnosed (Type 2) and then at least every 2 years or more often if recommended by your doctor, optometrist or ophthalmologist.
- Have weight and waist circumference checked regularly
- Have blood pressure checked every GP visit.
- Have cholesterol & triglycerides checked every 12 months.
- Have kidney function checked when first diagnosed (Type 2) and then at least every 12 months.
- Have dental checks at least every 6 months.
- Have HbA1c checked every 3 - 6 months.
- Avoid smoking. If you wish to stop it may help to attend a smoking cessation clinic.
- Keep up to date with your doctor's appointments and health checks.
- Keep a record of results from all tests.

3. Going into Hospital

If going into hospital we encourage you or your family/carer to inform medical staff of your diabetes and current treatment. Please ensure that your diabetes is monitored during your stay in hospital. Discuss with staff regarding your diabetes self management and develop an agreed plan for your stay in hospital.



4. Diabetes and Pregnancy

Pregnancy and pregnancy planning for a woman with diabetes requires a specialist multidisciplinary team approach to protect both your health and the health of your baby.

It is recommended that you read "Can I have a healthy baby?" booklet available free from your Diabetes Educator or Diabetes Australia Victoria.



5. Diabetes and Licences

If you hold a current licence of any sort and have diabetes, you are required by law to notify either VicRoads or the licensing body. It is recommended that you notify VicRoads in writing and keep a copy of the notification. If you take medication for your diabetes you will need a medical report completed by your doctor to send to VicRoads. It is also necessary to inform VicRoads if you have a commercial licence.

Some insurance companies also require that you notify them and it is advisable to check with your insurer.

6. Diabetes Care Plans

We recommend discussing with your GP about your eligibility to access multidisciplinary chronic disease care plans. These plans allow you to access 5 subsidised allied health visits annually.

7. Obtaining Supplies

- It is advisable to register with the National Diabetes Service Scheme (NDSS) (See details p.9) to enable you to obtain diabetes consumables at a discounted government subsidised price from authorized NDSS outlets.

a) Blood Glucose Meters

It is recommended to discuss blood glucose meters with your diabetes educator prior to purchasing. Diabetes educators can advise you on the best meter/s to suit your needs and teach all aspects of blood glucose monitoring. They will also be aware of discount options, company promotions and the availability of free meters. Alternatively meters can be purchased from NDSS outlets or local pharmacies.

If you have private health insurance with ancillary cover you may be able to claim a rebate. A letter from your doctor stating that you require a blood glucose meter for monitoring your diabetes is required when making a claim.

The Department of Veterans' Affairs will supply a meter free of charge to gold card holders and to white card holders where diabetes is accepted as caused by their service.

Please note that meters have a lifetime warranty and your meter company will provide you with a free replacement meter should yours be faulty or out of date. Batteries and record books are usually provided by the meter company free of charge. To obtain these phone the company on their toll free number. All meter companies provide a 24 hour toll free number to assist with meter problems or enquiries (The number may be listed on the back of your meter or record book).

b) Blood glucose & urine testing strips.

These can be purchased at the NDSS outlets at a discount price, with the appropriate cards.

Blood testing strips can also be obtained with a prescription from your doctor or over the counter from a pharmacy (note: check prices before purchasing).

Insulin for Life - Insulin or glucose strips, which are:

- No longer needed
- Unopened
- In-date (with at least 3 months to use-by date)

Can be donated to help to keep alive people with diabetes overseas. Donations will be sent overseas as part of a humanitarian emergency donation program organized by Insulin for Life Inc.

c) Lancet devices and lancets (needles to obtain blood droplet from fingers for testing glucose level)

Lancets are available from NDSS outlets and most pharmacies but are not subsidised by the NDSS. Lancet devices are usually provided with your blood glucose meter, but can also be purchased separately at NDSS outlets and pharmacies. Do not share your lancet devices with other people, even if you change the lancet.

d) Record book & diaries

These are available from either your NDSS outlet, your diabetes educator or the supplier of your blood glucose meter. Please note: record books for insulin pumps need to be ordered from the pump supplier. Some insulin pump companies have a small charge for their books.

e) Sharps containers for disposal of your used lancets and needles

By law it is essential for needles and lancets to be placed in an approved sharps container. These are available free of charge from your local council or community health centre, and when full, should be returned for safe disposal.

f) Medication & insulin

These are available from pharmacies. A script from your doctor is required and it is advisable to speak with your diabetes educator prior to purchasing your insulin for the first time.

g) Reusable pens for giving insulin

These can be obtained at no charge from your diabetes educator. They can advise you on the most suitable pens and needles to use and teach how to safely administer your insulin.





→ The NDSS is a government subsidised scheme which enables you to obtain diabetes consumables at no cost or a discounted price from authorised outlets.

h) Registering for the National Diabetes Service Scheme (NDSS)

The NDSS is a government subsidised scheme which enables you to obtain diabetes consumables at no cost or a discounted price from authorised outlets.

NDSS registration is free and open to all Australians diagnosed with diabetes. To access the NDSS you will need to complete an orange NDSS registration form provided by your doctor, diabetes educator, NDSS outlet or you can download a form from www.ndss.com.au. The form must be fully completed and signed by your doctor or a credentialed diabetes educator. If you hand the form in at an NDSS outlet (rather than posting it) you will be able to purchase subsidised diabetes supplies immediately as the form is proof that you have diabetes. Within 3 weeks you should receive an NDSS card to enable you to continue to obtain supplies.

NDSS staff will assist you with ordering your diabetes supplies. You will need to have your Medicare card, NDSS card, and Pension card, Veteran's Affairs card or Health Care Card (if applicable) available with you (and advise if you have reached the Medicare Safety Net).

To change your registration details visit an NDSS outlet, call Diabetes Australia Victoria (DAV) or download a change of details form from www.ndss.com.au. Misplaced or damaged cards can be replaced by contacting DAV. Yearly taxation receipts for NDSS products can also be provided by DAV.

Note: if you commence insulin a signed updated NDSS form is required to access free needles.

The following are available from NDSS outlets at a discounted price:

- Blood glucose strips for your meter.
- Urine glucose & ketone testing strips (Type 1 Diabetes)
- Urine testing strips
- Pump supplies (Pump supplies will have to be ordered from Diabetes Australia Victoria, allow 1-2 weeks for delivery).
If issues occur with pump supplies contact your 24 hour pump company hotline.

The following are available at no charge from NDSS outlets:

- Insulin syringes
- Insulin pen needles

The following are available from NDSS outlets but are not subsidized:

- Lancets (to obtain a blood drop from the finger)
- Blood glucose meters (It is advisable to discuss meters with your diabetes educator before purchasing)
- Blood Ketone strips for people diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes
